Earlyille Opera House is celebrating its 50th Anniversary as a Multi Arts Center in 2022. To gear up for this wonderful celebration, we are recruiting designs for a commemorative 50th year logo that will be incorporated into marketing and merchandise throughout the year, thereafter becoming a permanent part of EOH's history. All artists are encourage to participate!

#### Submitted logos must include:

- Dates of: 1972-2022
- "50th anniversary" tag line
- Picture/sketch of building

- Can be digital or drawn, digital must be in pdf, png or jpeg format
- Solid black and white with transparent background (no shading, we will use our own color choices)
- Image must be no smaller than 1.5" x 1.5" and no larger than 7" x 7".

#### What to Expect:

- The artist whose work is chosen will be required to sign a contract relinquishing logo ownership and rights to the EOH.
- Artist will be publicly credited and given recognition for the chosen logo design.
- All submitted logos will be represented in an online exhibit.
- Artist can incorporate their chosen logo into personal portfolio.
- A stipend of \$250 will be provided to the chosen artist.
- Logo will be used from chosen date through 2022, thereafter incorporated into EOH archival history.

#### Submission Deadline: June 30, 2021

### **BROOME, CHENANGO & OTSEGO COUNTY DECENTRALIZATION (DEC) GRANT PROGRAM**

PURPOSE AND HISTORY OF THE DEC PROGRAM:

The New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) is dedicated to preserving and expanding the rich and diverse cultural resources that are and will become the heritage of New York's citizens. In 1977, NYSCA developed the Decentralization program to ensure New York State's cultural funding reached every part of the State. This program is funded in all 62 counties, and funds are regranted at a local level. Through this program, not-for-profit organizations and individual artists may apply annually for grants up to \$5000 to help strengthen the arts and cultural programs in their communities. The goal is to make state arts support available to geographically, economically, and ethnically diverse segments of the state's population. The DEC Program has been administered in Chenango County since 1986 and Earlville Opera House began administering the DEC program in 2020 at the invitation of NYSCA.
