Virtual FUNdraiser


Join us for some post-election pleasure on **Thursday**, **November 5**th at 8pm via the **Earlville Opera House's Facebook and YouTube platforms** for a live musical performance by The Sea The Sea (Chuck and Mira Costa). The performance is a collaboration between EOH and Colgate University's Brown Commons Coffeehouse Music Series. **This is a give-what-you-like event with all proceeds supporting the programs and services of the Earlville Opera House during this time of crisis for performing arts venues**. The Sea The Sea is an Upstate New York based indie folk-pop duo-band featuring what Huffington Post calls, "Two of the loveliest male-female voices you might ever hear this or any other year." With the recent release of *Stumbling Home*, their third full-length studio album, *The Sea The Sea* firmly establishes their position as two of the most compelling voices on the indie folk scene. With a heavy dose of creativity and whimsy, they have crafted an album with a soundscape and narrative uniquely suited to their incredible harmonies. The song "Broken" was recently featured on NPR's "Heavy Rotation: 15 Songs Public Radio Can't Stop Playing."

Their 2014 debut release, "Love We Are We Love", also received praise from NPR, American Songwriter, and No Depression, among others, gathering over 15 million streams on Spotify. The animated video for their song "Waiting" sparked viral interest including Buzzfeed, Pitchfork, and inclusion at the international TED 2015 conference. Mountain Stage host Larry Groce calls them "ready to take their place among the best young male/female duos now performing." Their 2016 release, the six-song EP "In the Altogether", earned features by Apple Music including "Best of the Week" and "A-List Singer/Songwriter." Recently, Paste Music/ Daytrotter described the band as "defined by their infallible vocal harmonies and their unconventional song arrangements. The Sea The Sea is a pop band only in their melodic infectiousness—otherwise they are at their best when subverting conventions."

This virtual collaboration will highlight an exhibit representing quality and vibrant regional contemporary and traditional quilts celebrating the rich quilting culture across New York State.
