Scott Cook
Arts Café Series

Scott Cook (www.scottcook.net) has been living out of a van or a backpack for a dozen years now, touring almost incessantly across Canada, the US, Europe, Asia, Australia and elsewhere, and distilling his experiences into straight-talking, keenly observant verse. His fourth independent release, *One More Time Around*, was nominated for a Canadian Folk Music Award, and its opening track "Pass It Along" won the Folk and Acoustic category in the 2013 UK Songwriting Contest, with UK magazine *Maverick Country* naming him "one of Canada's most inspiring and imaginative storytellers". He's currently touring in support of his sixth studio album, *Further Down the Line*, which earned Cook his second CFMA nomination (English Songwriter of the Year), and comes packaged in a 132-page book containing a look back, in words and pictures, on his last decade of full-time travel. Cook is one of the hardest-working DIY troubadours on the road today, averaging over 150 shows and a dozen festivals every year since 2007.

What's the difference between a fiddle and a violin? In the hands of a celebrated guest soloist with over 50 Symphony Orchestras, who also shreds electric fiddle through fuzz, wah and looping effects ...who is called "the future of the Celtic Fiddle" by the Washington Post, and "the Jimi Hendrix of the violin" by the New York Times ...who is Bronx born, yet the 9-time All-Ireland Fiddle Champion. What's the difference? Nothing, in the hands of Eileen Ivers.

Grammy®-Awarded and Emmy-nominated, Eileen Ivers, continues to push the fiddling tradition boundaries from a folk music staple to a fiercely fresh, powerfully beautiful, intensely driving world stage experience. Eileen has performed with Sting, 'Fiddlers 3' with Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg and Regina Carter, Patti Smith, Al Di Meola, The Chieftains, was the groundbreaking Musical Star of Riverdance, a founding member of Cherish the Ladies, a former member of the Hall & Oates band, a featured instrumentalist on soundtracks including "Gangs of New York" and Back to Titanic", and she is one of the most awarded All-Ireland Fiddle and Banjo champions ever. Eileen has been proclaimed "a national treasure" by NCTA Board Chairman George Holt as she celebrates her 30 plus year career as a performer, composer, producer, songwriter, band leader, educator, multi-instrumentalist and renowned pioneer in connecting her American, Irish traditional, jazz, blues, and world roots.

BROOME, CHENANGO & OTSEGO COUNTY STATE COMMUNITY REGRANT (SCR) PROGRAM (Formerly Decentralization)

PURPOSE AND HISTORY OF THE SCR PROGRAM:

The New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) is dedicated to preserving and expanding the rich and diverse cultural resources that are and will become the heritage of New York's citizens. In 1977, NYSCA developed the former Decentralization (DEC) Program, now called the State Community Regrant (SCR) Program, to ensure New York

State's cultural funding reached every part of the State. This program is funded in all 62 counties, and funds are regranted at a local level. Through this program, not-for-profit organizations and artists may apply annually for grants up to \$5000 to help strengthen the arts and cultural programs in their communities. The goal is to make state arts support available to geographically, economically, and ethnically diverse segments of the state's population. The SCR Program has been administered in Chenango County since 1986 and Earlville Opera House began administering the SCR program in 2020 at the invitation of NYSCA. Nominations for grant review panels are accepted on a rolling basis. For more information, contact Victoria Kappel at: victoria.kappel@earlvilleoperahouse.com

The Earlville Opera House (EOH) is pleased to announce a continuation in funding from the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) for the 2022 Broome, Chenango & Otsego Statewide Community Regrants Program (SCR). Formerly known as the Decentralization or DEC Program, funding is available to non-profit organizations and artists who partner with an eligible non-profit for cultural initiatives in 2022. Funding is available for grants up to \$5,000 each to support Community Arts and Arts Education grants in Broome, Chenango and Otsego counties. Included in this funding is \$15,000 provided by the Stewart W. and Willma C. Hoyt Foundation of Binghamton to support Broome County SCR projects.

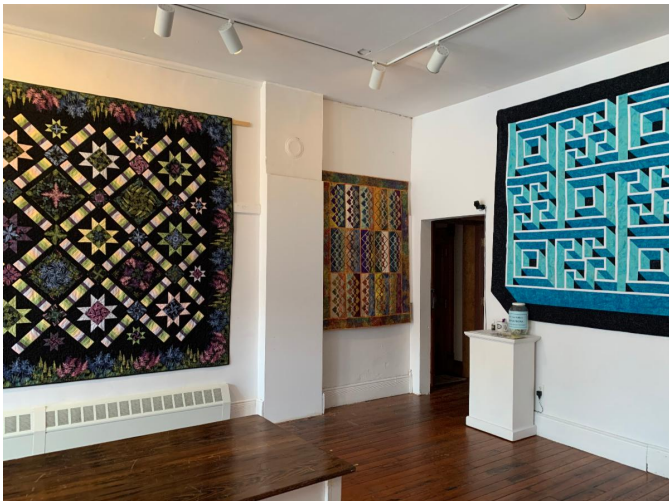
